RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARROYO GRANDE AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF OF POLICE TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY REGIONAL SPECIAL WEAPONS AND TACTICS TEAM

WHEREAS, the Cities of Arroyo Grande, Grover Beach, Morro Bay, Paso Robles, Pismo Beach, San Luis Obispo, along with the California Polytechnic State University San Luis Obispo (Cal Poly) and California State Parks have operated a Regional SWAT Team under a previously signed written agreement; and

WHEREAS, the participating agencies' chief law enforcement officer has reviewed and prepared a new Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) modernizing the language in several sections, including but not limited to the Purpose, Term, Agency Responsibilities, Agency Budgeting and Indemnification; and

WHEREAS, the MOU has been reviewed by the participating agencies legal counsels, who have approved the MOU as to form; and

WHEREAS, the term of the updated MOU will run through 2029, which the option for automatic renewal in five-year increments as long as no substantive changes are needed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Arroyo Grande does hereby authorize the Chief of Police to sign a Memorandum of Understanding, in substantially the form attached, for the City to participate in the San Luis Obispo Regional Special Weapons and Tactics Team (Regional SWAT Team).
