**SUBJECT:** Monthly Water Supply and Demand Update

**DATE:** October 22, 2024

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**RECOMMENDATION:**

Receive and file the Monthly Water Supply and Demand Update.

**IMPACT ON FINANCIAL AND PERSONNEL RESOURCES:**

Approximately two (2) hours of staff time is required to prepare the report.

**BACKGROUND:**

The City of Arroyo Grande's water entitlements are calculated on a water year that begins April 1<sup>st</sup>. The current water supply for water year 2024/2025 includes 2,290 Acre Feet from Lopez Reservoir, the current modeled, safe yield is 357 Acre Feet of groundwater from the Santa Maria River Groundwater Basin, with an entitlement of 1,323 Acre Feet. An additional 160 Acre Feet of groundwater is available from the Pismo formation.

The predicted water use for the 2024/2025 water year is 2,100 Acre Feet.

The monthly water use for the City in September 2024 was 210.9 Acre Feet. Attachment 3 has been revised to show the comparison of the previous year's use, October 2022 through September 2023 vs. the current years use, October 2023 through September 2024. The increase is directly related to rainfall totals over the two years.

The per capita monthly water use for September 2024 is 127 gallons per day/per person. The residential per capita use was 99 gallons per day/per person. There was a total of 0.0 inches of rainfall in the City in September 2024.

**ANALYSIS OF ISSUES:**

The United States Drought Monitor, as of October 11, 2024, shows San Luis Obispo County is not in a drought. Rainfall for the period of July 1, 2024, through October 11,

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2024, is 0.0 inches at the Corporation Yard rain gauge. Lopez Lake is 93.9% capacity as of October 11, 2024.

The deep well index for the third quarter of 2024 was completed on July 3, 2024, and is 11.57 feet above sea level, which is 4.07 feet above the threshold value. The current deep well index is 0.66 feet lower than April 2024, and 6.23 feet higher than July 2023.

The report provides the City Council and the public with the current and projected conditions of our water supply and demand.
