

Mayor's Commendation Presented to Officer Alejandro Estrada

The City of Arroyo Grande and the Arroyo Grande Police Department believes in the recognition of officers, their actions, and outstanding efforts in service to the community and their fellow officers. In keeping with this belief, the City of Arroyo Grande and the Arroyo Grande Police Department recognize Officer Alejandro Estrada for his outstanding, lifesaving efforts that occurred on May 23, 2022.

On Monday, May 23, 2022, at approximately 1303 hours, Officer Estrada was dispatched to a reported medical emergency for an 83-year-old female who was possibly suffering from a stroke. Prior to his arrival, Dispatch advised the patient was struggling for air and turning purple. Officer Estrada arrived to find the patient on the ground in front of the residence. Officer Estrada began resuscitating the patient with a bag valve mask and continued rescue breathing for the patient until paramedic ambulance and Fire personnel arrived.

CPR was continued with EMS, including cardiac defibrillation, and the patient was transported to a local emergency room where she received further treatment. After a stay in Intensive Care, the patient was released from the hospital and returned to her residence.

Officer Estrada's quick response, recognition of the severity of the emergency, immediate actions, and effective medical assistance resulted in directly saving the life of Ms. Janette Morris.
