


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Hello AG City Council,






Leviticus 18: 22: "You shall not lie with a male as with a woman. It is an abomination."

A public display of this flag is inappropriate in this public setting since it indicates that the citizens of our city endorse this behavior which is not the case for myself, my family, and many other residents.


